| <b>Dog getting over excited when interacting with children</b> | <p>The dog will always be in the care of a responsible adult and will never be allowed to freely roam the school premises unsupervised. The dog will work with children on a 1:1 basis or in very small groups and will be slowly introduced to more children. Children are not left with the dog unsupervised. During the school day the dog will always be on a lead when she is out of the SLT office, except when she is undergoing structured training with her primary trainer or is supervised in an enclosed area.</p> <p>The dog will mainly be working in the SLT office, Hub or Library and therefore will never be around all children. | <b>Children's understanding of how to behave around a dog</b>  | <p>Children will meet the dog in a group of no more than six children, following 'approach, ask, pet, goodbye'. Pupils working with the dog will be taught how to read dog behaviour and the impact of their actions. The dog will work with children on a 1:1 basis or in very small groups and will be slowly introduced to more children. Education of this nature will continually be given to children working with the dog, specific workshops from outside professionals, including the Blue Cross / Dog Trust, in class time and PSHE lessons. | <b>Dogs behaviour in general</b>                               | <p>The dog will be trained not to jump up or bite and has been through training. 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|  | <p>training with an experienced dog trainer. All staff will have been introduced to the dog and the expectations.</p> <p>Dogs express their feelings through their body language. Growling or bearing of teeth indicate that the dog is feeling angry or threatened. Flattened ears, tail lowered or between their legs, hiding behind their owner, whining or growling are signs that the dog is frightened or nervous. If the dog is displaying any of these warning signs it should be immediately removed from that particular situation or environment.</p> <p>Should a bite occur (even playfully):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Parents will be contacted immediately.</li> <li>2. The wound will be cleaned and covered with a sterile, non-sticky dressing.</li> <li>3. The child/adult will be released for medical attention.</li> <li>4. All staff will be informed.</li> <li>5. A full investigation will take place.</li> <li>6. The suitability of having a dog in school will be reassessed by the Headteacher/Chair of Governors.</li> </ol> |                                     |                          |                          |
| <b>Scratch from dog claws</b>              | The dog will attend the groomers regularly to make sure her claws are kept short and is also walked on concrete/tarmac to keep them trimmed.   | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> | <input type="checkbox"/> | <input type="checkbox"/> |
| <b>Keeping safe when dog walking.</b>      | A member of staff will always have the school dog on the lead and have responsibility to ensure that they have control of her. Children, in very small groups, may walk with the school dog with a member of staff. The member of staff will always hold the lead. Children are supervised at all times by the member of staff. (Permission to walk offsite would always be gained from parents/carers beforehand). | <b>Tripping over the dog – trip hazard</b> | All members of school community to be vigilant to look where they are walking to avoid tripping over the dog. | <b>Loose Dog</b>   | <p>If the dog does get loose from the SLT office the teacher on duty will call for a designated staff member who will come and put the dog back in the office. There are five members of staff who will be called upon in the event of the dog getting loose or if it needs attention at any other time, they are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Miss Waite</li> <li>2. Mrs King</li> <li>3. Mrs Hughes</li> <li>4. Miss McEnaney</li> <li>5. Mrs Evans</li> </ol> <p>The dog will mainly be working in the SLT office, Hub or Library and therefore will be with an adult when moving around.</p>  | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> | <input type="checkbox"/> | <input type="checkbox"/> |
| <b>Dog hair causing allergies</b>                            | <p>The school dog is a Cockapoo, which is a low moulting breed to reduce the chance of an allergic reaction. Parents will be asked to inform the school of any known allergies prior to introduction of the dog to school. A list of any children who should not interact with the dog will be kept by the SLT team/teachers and office staff. Staff members have also been asked to inform the SLT Team of any allergies. Fully supervised, children will have the opportunity to interact with the dog as they wish and those with allergies will be able to opt out of interaction. Children will be taught to wash their hands after active participation with the dog. Wounds on exposed skin will be covered. Flea treatment will be carried out at monthly intervals. | <b>Risk of food contamination/disease/germs from the dog</b> | <p>If the dog is sick she will not come into school until she is better. The dog will never go into a food preparation area and/ or the kitchen.</p> <p>Should the dog defecate on the school site a member of staff will clear this up immediately and dispose of it in the main external bins, not in an internal bin. Poo bags will be carried by the staff member walking the dog. | <b>Financial cost of the dog's upkeep</b>                    | <p>The dog is the financial responsibility of Miss Waite. She is financially responsible for all her care and day-to-day costs. | <b>Noise / Barking</b>  | Cockapoo's are bred to be sociable dogs and are often used as therapy dogs as they are known to be good with children. The dog has been introduced to children from birth so is used to a noisy environment, therefore reducing the chance of barking. | <b>Dog Phobia</b>   | Parents will be asked to inform the school if their child is scared to be in close contact with the dog. Parents will be offered support for child to help overcome aversion. Parents also offered the option of their child having no close contact. A list of any children who should not interact with the dog will be kept by the office staff. Visitors will be advised that a dog is in the office and removed if requested.
