



St Paul's C of E Primary School PE and Sports Premium Overview 2022/2023

Overview	<p>The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years since 2013 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The Sports Premium is ring-fenced and can only be spent on provision of PE and sports in schools. In the year 2022-2023 premium is £17551.</p> <p>The school's Sports Premium lead is the PE Sports Leader, Miss Daryl Purves.</p>
Principles	<p>As a school, St Paul's will continue to abide by the following five key indicators:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school. 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement. 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport. 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils. 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Our 2022/23 plans to spend this money	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Specialist Sports coach (Ignite) to support teacher CPD and children's attainment in PE. • Clubs led by specialist coaches from York Knights and Ignite. • Sport & PE Equipment. • York Knights Rugby League coaches to support teacher CPD and pupil's attainment in PE. • Continuing the use of our chosen PE Scheme to enhance teaching of the PE curriculum • Playground equipment and resources. • Offer a variety of clubs/extra-curricular activities.
Desired impact of the plans for 2022/2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Access to specialist sports coaching provides staff with CPD to develop and improve their personal teaching of PE. • Access to specialise coaching provides strong sports provision for the children, ensuring more children take part in physical activity. • PE and sports equipment/resources are rejuvenated within the school. • Investment in playtime equipment promotes active playtimes and competitive sports. • To keep up level of competitive sport, achieve the School Game Mark. • More children, including those with SEN or additional needs to access inclusive opportunities for physical activity. • Children to be more aware of the impact of exercise on mental health and well-being. • Deliver more opportunities for children to be active throughout the day through GoNoodle, brain breaks, just dance, Jack Hartmann. • Clubs to provide enrichment for the pupils and new experiences too. • Enhance PE teaching throughout school in order to have a positive impact on the children's wellbeing.
How we plan to make sure these improvements are sustainable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our specialist sports coach, new PE scheme and other sports specialists provides specialist coaching to our teachers and staff, providing quality CPD that will help them teach their own PE lessons both now and in future years. Staff will increase their knowledge and understanding for the future. It will also give them new approaches and ideas.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Investments in PE equipment will sustain quality provision over the years to come. Children are taught strategies to access physical exercise, understanding its link to good mental and physical health. This raises their potential for effective learning. Clubs will be varied and provide children with equal/differing opportunities. Clubs will also be monitored/checked over the terms so a variety of children will be able to attend, meaning more children will get the opportunity to do a club.
Impact of the Sports Premium Funding 2021/22	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Sports Specialist offered valuable CPD opportunities for teaching physical education, especially those who are less confident with the subject. The Sports funding last year has helped to develop our ongoing PE and sport provision. We have added new playground equipment which has helped boost sport on the playground, meaning that children are more active throughout the day. YSSN enabled the school to enter and participate in a range of competitions and tournaments with schools from across the York area. A wide range of children are encouraged to participate and it has allowed children to experience competitive sports organised by professional coaches.

Currently 44.4 % of children in Year 3 can swim at the National Curriculum requirement of 25m.
