Doodle Maths – Classes 2, 3, 4 and 5

As you are aware, we launched Doodle Maths in school last term and now we have had time to transition over to this new programme, I would like to invite you into school to share Doodle Maths, its features and allow you to ask any questions you may have.

An outline of Doodle Maths at St Paul's CE Primary School

We have made the transition to move from MyMaths, our old Maths homework system to Doodle Maths. In school all children have completed a 'baseline' on Doodle Maths and work is now individually set to improve each child's understanding of different topics within maths.

Children have used Doodle Maths in school to get used to the new system, feedback has been positive as children find it much easier to use and enjoy the videos that support their learning. Homework is set to reinforce teaching which has taken place in class but also as a way of keeping you informed of what your child is doing at school and you being able to support your child with their learning.

Teachers will set a homework task each week, usually on a Friday, that appears as a red 'assignment' box on your child's home page. Homework is to be completed by the following Friday. Those children who have not completed it on Thursday will be sent home a reminder, which may be in the form of a note or a sticker, so that parents can support them in completing it. For children in Class 5 we would expect them to begin to have some more independence with their homework and complete this independently, asking for help if they need it. This will help them prepare for the transition to Class 6 and Secondary School where they will be expected to complete homework weekly. Please note that Class 6 have different Maths homework and this will be explained to parents next year.

We do appreciate that things happen which means your child will not be able to complete it by the Friday. If this is the case please speak to your child's teacher and we can either give them additional time to complete it or arrange for it to be completed in school. If we have not been informed why the homework has not been completed, your child will do it during the day on Friday at a time that is convenient for the staff in the classroom.
