Topic Overview

Bienvenido a Mexico! Get ready to explore this unique country, from its towering temples and stunning geography to its pulsing rhythms and its fun-packed festivals. Is your tummy rumbling? Concoct a traditional fruit cocktail or a delicious Mexican meal. What's on your shopping list? Go steady with the spices. Discover the mysterious world of the ancient Mayan civilisation. Make their chocolate, learn their poetry and follow all of their curious rituals. Feel like celebrating? Design a flute, grab a drum, join a tribe and make some noise. During this half term, we'll watch a traditional Mexican performance and join in with percussion instruments. We'll use non-fiction books to find out about the importance of music in Mexican culture. We'll base our writing around our new whole class book 'Holes'. We'll try our hand at making traditional Mexican drinks and savoury dishes. We'll learn about the 'Day of the Dead' and create 3-D skulls. Using maps, we'll locate Mexico and explore its natural features. We'll discover what daily life is like and how it has changed over time. Then we'll craft Maya chocolate and simple woodwind instruments from recycled materials. Who can make the highest, loudest and longest sounds? At the end of the project, we'll listen to Maya music and learn a traditional song. We'll also perform Mexican music from the past and present. Have you got what it takes to be chief? Let's find out.
